playing together. We know children need this for their socio-emotional and neural development, and we know we need it to return to work!

COVID 19 has brought childcare and early learning into the spotlight at the national level. Issues that faced our industry long before COVID are now heightened under the additional strain of the pandemic. With 30-50% of licensed childcare facilities at risk of permanent closure across the US, many ECE teachers making poverty wages, and working parents financially stretched by tuition payments, we know we need to make a collective investment in the system for our children, our teachers, and our families.

We are so fortunate that our community has made that investment locally in Little Star! Thanks to you, our financial aid program is here to help families, our teachers are paid above average wages for early learning providers, and we've been able to stay open since early in the pandemic to serve working families.

But there is more work to do! We've joined a state-wide effort to advocate for a system that ensures all children and families can get the care they need, teachers are fairly compensated for their important work (and have health insurance!) and childcare centers can operate with long-term

financial sustainability.
